




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## EXECUTIVE LEGISLATIVE AGENDA AND CAPACITY DEVELOPMENT AGENDA





## Message of the Vice Mayor

Since assumption of office in July 2019 to date and in matter of four (4) months, the Sangguniang Panlungsod has been working too hard, fast and furious, so to speak.

In a short span of time, imagine in just on (1) month, the Resident ID System, an ordinance for SELFIE Program has been legislated and finally passed.

Approximately ten (10) Ordinances has various sectoral concerns have been passed and ready for implementation. To name a few, we have an ordinance providing additional financial assistance to Senior Citizens for GROUPIE Program under the 10-point agenda. Thanks to City Councilor Aquino.

Recently we passed the Ordinance for the integration of Senior Citizens and Persons with Disabilities into the workforce of all business establishments in the City, yours truly being its proponent.

We also adopted the New Tricycle Franchise Code. I am confident that the same could cure the defect and chaos in tricycle franchising system which we inherited from the previous administration.

In addition, the Sangguniang Panlungsod through its Committee on Franchise conducted the actual and physical inventory of tricycle units with valid franchise to determine the exact number of tricycle franchise. The same council will provide assessment for possible allowance of all pending applications accepted by the previous council or the same should be closed in all respect. Thank you Councilor Baldon.

More or less fifteen (15) draft ordinances are still in the hands of some committee chairmen. Several legislations may be regarded as significant milestones for a progressive and more developed Sorsogon City.

The proposed New Revenue Coded has already been referred to the Committee on Ways and Means with Hon. Lubiano as the author. The council members proposed the creation of Oversight Committee for the purpose of efficient revenue collections. There is a need to implement efficient collection system requiring the big business establishments and corporations to pay their tax obligations according to their earned profits. Efficient tax collection denotes more revenues for the benefit of Sorsogon City.

In line with my advocacy for youth welfare, I have proposed the Comprehensive Youth, Education and Sports Code or the Yes Ordinance which has been referred to the Committee on Youth and Sports Development chaired by Hon. Abenion. The Yes Ordinance will provide opportunities such as the alternative Learning System, Technical Education and Skills Development especially for out of school

youth, financial-educational assistance for the athletes. Moreover, the upgrading and provisions for the city sports facilities being emphasized under the said ordinance.

I am hoping that the legislative sponsorship by Hon. Bhem Dioneda be readily done so as to pass and implement the most comprehensive Tourism Code for the City of Sorsogon.

In light of the 10-point Agenda of the executive department of the City Government of Sorsogon, it is important that we craft policies and implement programs which are reflective of the real issues and problems of the people. We do not need millions of programs. We only need few but quality alternative programs for the Sorsogon City constituents.

It is my fervent hope that as we ponder upon the ideals and discuss about the feasible programs and rational policies during the executive-legislative conference, we commit to implement the salient aspects beneficial to the development of Sorsogon City.



Nonetheless, the executive department could count on us. In the best interest of Sorsogonon, we in the 7<sup>th</sup> City Council willingly sustain our never-ending support to the 10-point Agenda of Hon. Mayor Ma. Ester E. Hamor. # QUICK FACTS ABOUT SORSOGON CITY

## Brief Historical Background

- With the coming of the Spanish colonizers in the 1600s, Bacon was organized into a visita of the town of Casiguran, one of the oldest settlements in Luzon. The municipality of Sorsogon, whose original site was in Sitio Pocdol in Capuy, was in turn, a visita of Bacon. As its population increased, however, Sorsogon was declared an independent, full-fledged parish in 1628.
- The Pueblo Civil de Bacon was established in 1754, with Juan Elias as its first gobernadorcillo. Sorsogon on the other hand, became an independent political unit in 1864.




Fig. 1 Geographical Location of Sorsogon City

- From their organization as visitas and eventually as independent pueblos, both Bacon and Sorsogon remained under the territorial jurisdiction of the province of Albay. On October 17, 1894, the Spanish authorities organized a geographical unit independent from Albay, with the town of Sorsogon as its seat of government. The new province adopted the name of the town and has since been known as the Province of Sorsogon
- The City of Sorsogon was created by virtue of Republic Act 8806, which was signed into law on August 16, 2000 and ratified during a plebiscite on December 16, 2000. RA 8806, also known as the Cityhood Law, called for the merger of the municipalities of Sorsogon and Bacon into a component city of the Province of Sorsogon. Sorsogon thus, functioned as a full-fledged city on June 30, 2001, with the assumption into office of the first city officials.

### **Location and Total Land Area**

- Sorsogon City covers 27,600 hectares. (276 sq.km.)
- In the Philippine map, Sorsogon City lies from 1230 53' to 1240 09' east longitude and from 120 55" to 130 08 north latitude. It is 600 km southeast of Manila and is located at the southernmost tip of Luzon.
- The city is bounded on the east by the municipalities of Pto. Diaz and Gubat, on the south by the municipality of Casiguran and Sorsogon Bay, on the west by the municipality of Castilla, on the northeast by the municipality of Manito in Albay, and on the north by Albay Gulf. Sorsogon is part of the geographical chain linking Luzon to the rest of the Philippines. It is a transshipment corridor and serves as the seat of the Province of Sorsogon.


